## The Upcoming Election

There is going to be an election in Canada on April 28, 2025.

If you are a Canadian citizen and are 18 years old or older, you have the right to vote for which person, or candidate, you want to represent where you live. The candidate with the most votes in each area, called a riding, will become a Member of Parliament. That person will represent their riding to vote to pass bills that will become new laws and policies in Canada.

## Limitations of This Resource

This guide gives a general overview of each party's platform. A platform is a party's plan for what they would do if they were elected. We used plain language to help everyone understand, but that means some details may be left out. This guide does not cover every plan for every party. For capacity reasons we included parties that run in Saskatchewan and had seats in the House of Commons before the election was called. We have also listed the parties alphabetically.

Platforms are formatted differently because each party has a different style and talks about different things. Some platforms have lots of information, and some have less. As we get closer to the election, each party will continue to share about their platform and add to their plans. This information was last updated April 4, 2025.

We have done our best to share highlights from each platform. It is always important to do your own research on the issues that are important to you. You can do this by looking at the platforms for each party online, or speaking to your local candidates about what they would like to do and what topics are important to you.

## Disability Benefits and Services

### Conservative Party of Canada

- Reduce income tax on lowest tax bracket from 15% to 12.75%
- Increase amount Canadians can invest in their TFSA
- Increase tax-free income seniors can earn each year

- Cut GST from home sales under \$1.3 million
- Sell federal buildings and land to build new homes
- Encourage cities to reduce barriers when building new homes

### Green Party of Canada

- Introduce Guaranteed Livable Income so no one lives in poverty
- Cut income tax on earnings under \$40,000, update tax system, and close tax loopholes

- Make sure housing built with public money stays affordable forever
- Stop corporations from buying up single family homes
- Build affordable and accessible housing

- Make Disability Tax Credit easier to apply for
- Fully fund Canada Disability Benefit to reduce poverty
- Improve access to health care and therapies

### Liberal Party of Canada

- Reduce income tax rates on lowest bracket by 1%
- Cancel consumer carbon tax
- Expand dental coverage eligibility to all ages

- Fund and build affordable housing and provide \$10 billion to affordable builders
- Convert buildings into affordable housing
- Cut GST from home sales under \$1 million for first time buyers

### New Democratic Party of Canada (NDP)

- Cut Income Tax on earnings under \$19,500
- Cut GST from essential items and cap grocery prices
- Raise Guaranteed Income Supplement for seniors

- Unlock public land to build rent-controlled homes
- Expand CMHC's mandate to include lower and longer mortgages
- Publicly finance new home construction

- Double Canada Disability Benefit from \$200 to \$400 a month

### Conservative Party of Canada

- Quickly build natural gas plants, mines, factories, ports
- Promises quick approval for new pipelines
- Build energy corridor across Canada

- Impose life sentences for human, gun, and fentanyl trafficking. Create intimate partner assault offense
- Build Arctic military base with more patrols, build more polar Navy ships

### Green Party of Canada

- Federal government to buy resources affected by tariffs and hold them in reserve to either sell later, use in Canada, or export to other countries

- Strengthen Arctic and Coastal security with more patrols, better equipment
- Create new National Emergency Response Agency and civil defense corps to respond to climate disasters

- Stop investing public money in oil and gas production, spend that money on clean energy instead, and protect workers in transition to clean energy

### Liberal Party of Canada

- Improve Employment Insurance system
- Build ports, railroads, airports, and highways to support economy
- Support trades affected by tariffs with funding and materials

- Expand Navy equipment and presence in Arctic
- Increase Armed Forces Recruitment
- Partner with allies to get new aircraft

- \$30 million top up to the Agriculture Clean Technology Program

### New Democratic Party of Canada (NDP)

- Improve Employment Insurance benefits, use tariff profits to support impacted workers
- Build roads, bridges, and transit, using Canadian workers and materials

- Build a new Canadian Border Services training centre to train more officers to meet border challenges

- End public subsidies and tax breaks for oil and gas companies, spend that money on a home renovation program for energy-saving upgrades
